



EASY-TO-SEW FLEECE SCARF



What you need.

- 2 yards of color 1 fleece
- 2 yards of color 2 fleece
- 2 yards of heavy interfacing for pattern
- Matching thread
- Scissors
- Fabric marker

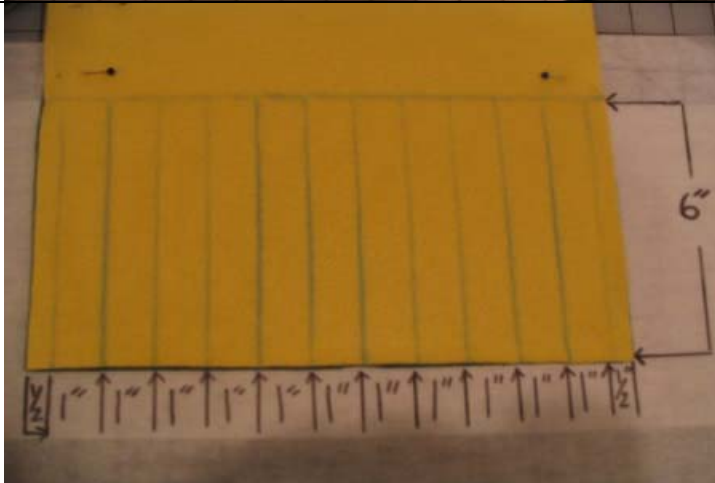
Take your interfacing and cut out a rectangle measuring 72"x 12". This will be your pattern.

Place the pattern lengthwise along the selvage edge of color 1, pin and cut (Cut 1)

Place the pattern lengthwise along the selvage edge of color 2, pin and cut (Cut 1)



Place color 1 on the table. Place color 2 directly on top of it. Match up all edges and pin the two layers together.



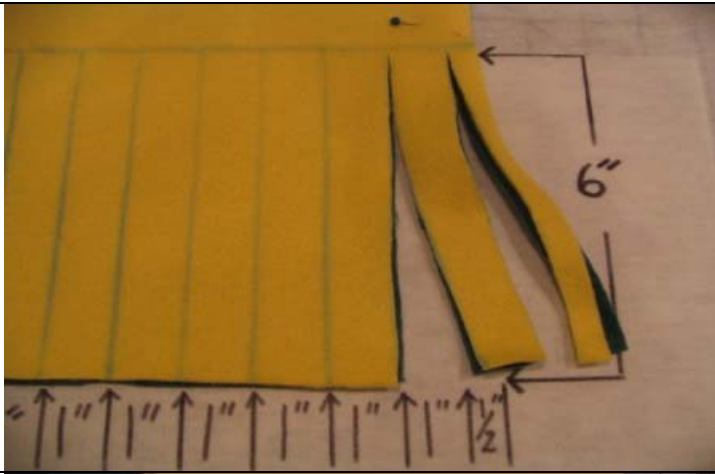
Using a fabric marker place a line 6" up from the end of scarf.

Now we are going to make the cutting lines for the fringe.

The first line: measure over $\frac{1}{2}$ " and make your first line.

Now measure over 1" for your next line. Keep marking each 1" line until you almost get to the end. The last line should be $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the edge.

(there should be the total of 12 lines)



Carefully cut up the cut lines through the two layers. Stop at the 6" mark.



At the 6" mark, cut off the two outside 1/2" wide pieces of fringe.

Be sure to look at the picture to see what it will look like.

Now follow the fringe directions for the other end of the scarf as well, so that both ends have fringe.



With a 1/2" seam allowance sew the two side seams together. Sew from the 6" mark (base of fringe) on one end down to the other 6" mark.



Turn the scarf inside out. Finger press the edges, and pin. Topstitch 1/2" in from the edge, starting at the base of the fringe on one side over to the base of the other. Repeat on the other side.



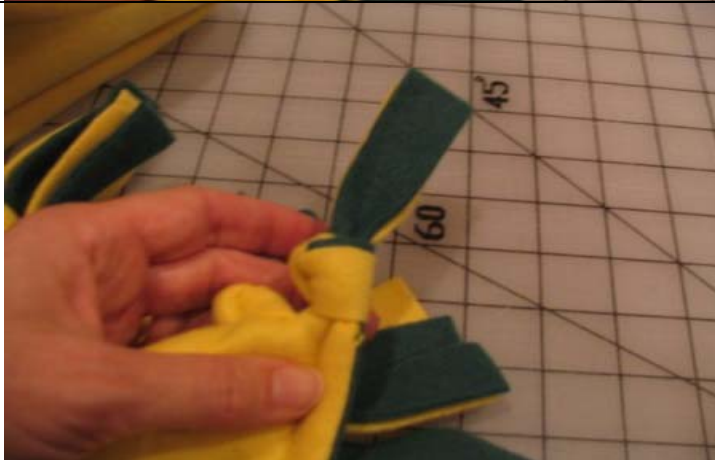
Lay out the scarf as above. The fringe should be all lined up again with color two on top of color1.

Pick up each set of colors, of each piece of fringe, and tie a knot as shown in the next three pictures.

Start a loop



Put end of fringe through loop



Tightening the knot



This is what the scarf will look like when you are finished. I have chosen my daughters school colors for this scarf.

There is enough fabric to make 4 of these wonderful warm winter scarves.

If you would like to make scarves for the men or women in the family for Christmas there are many great solids and prints in fleece that you can choose from. Go wild! I'm sure the people who get them for gifts will!
